A Wewahitchka man walked into a car dealership in Okaloosa County and left in a Porsche after paying with a check printed from his home computer, authorities say.

Casey William Kelley, 42, was arrested Wednesday for grand theft of a motor vehicle and uttering a false banknote.

He also tried to buy Rolex watches with a bad check, according to an arrest report from the Walton County Sheriff's Office.

During the investigation it was determined Kelley had purchased a Porsche 911 Turbo from a Porsche dealership in Destin by using a fraudulent check written for \$139,203.05 on Monday, July 27.

The Porsche was reported stolen to the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office. The next day, Kelley presented a check in the amount of \$61,521 to a jeweler in Miramar Beach in an attempt to purchase three Rolex watches, the report said.

When arrested Wednesday afternoon, Kelley told investigators he printed out the cashier's checks from his home computer and did not get them from his bank.

Kelley was transported and booked into the Walton County Jail without incident.

Florida Couple Spent Days In Unlocked Closet, Thought They Were Trapped

A Florida man and woman spent two days trapped in what they said they believed to be a locked closet -- until police let them out and discovered that the door was actually never locked.

John Arwood, 31, and Amber Campbell, 25, claimed they were chased into a janitor's closet at Daytona State College in Daytona Beach, Fla., by unidentified assailants on Sunday, according to the Daytona Beach Police Department's report.

The pair waited two days in the closet before calling 911.
Police officers found the couple in the Marine and Environmental Science Center on Dec. 30.

After they opened the door for the woman and man, a police officer checked if the door would lock on the inside. An officer went into the closet, closed the door and found it had, in fact, been unlocked the whole time.

Police said they found in the closet human feces and a scouring pad, the latter of which is commonly used to smoke crack cocaine. No drugs were found.

Arwood and Campbell were charged with trespassing. Campbell was also charged with violating her probation.

Arwoood's criminal record includes armed burglary and theft of firearms.

Florida Man Charged with Stripping in Stranger's Home, Chanting "5, 6, 7, 8... Grandma"

<u>Florida Man Spends Day Pulling All Fire Alarms in Local Middle School</u> <u>without Getting Caught</u>

A man was charged after deputies said he walked into another person's house, removed his clothes and shouted nonsensical phrases before resisting arrest.

The Palm Beach Sheriff's Office said a man named Conrad Hopper walked through the unlocked door of a home at 9240 Braclet Drive Saturday night in Lake Worth.

Deputies said Hopper was in a state of "excited delirium."

The person inside the home was feeding his aunt's dogs at the time and told deputies Hopper appeared intoxicated, but not from alcohol.

Hopper then began touching the victim's face and tried to take the victim's glasses off, according to deputies. Hopper then started taking all his clothes off while making loud, nonsensical statements, so the victim left the house and called 911.

When authorities arrived, they said they saw Hopper walking around completely naked "in a menacing manner" and breaking objects in the house.

He was shouting statements such as "5,6,7,8....grandma......grandma......girlfriend.......1234," according to deputies.

He eventually walked out through the back door of the house holding a large clock with sharp utensils protruding from its border, deputies said.

Officials told him to lie down on his face and he sat down instead. When officials released canine officers, Hopper started punching them and trying to gouge their eyes out, deputies said. He did the same when he was approached by four deputies.

Finally, Hopper was subdued by a stun gun, but it took six more deputies and fire rescue members to restrain him.

Hopper was taken to Wellington Hospital for evaluation. He was charged with burglary, simple battery, criminal mischief, aggravated battery on a law enforcement officer, battery on a K-9 officer and resisting arrest with violence.

MADISON, Fla. — A Florida man was put in jail Monday after he decided to improvise during an alleged robbery at a Madison Waffle House, according to deputies.

The Madison County Sheriff's Office said a Waffle House employee called them to the restaurant after a man, identified as 28-year-old Eward Wiliam Rodriguez of Madison, tried robbing them.

Sheriff David Harper said witnesses told deputies that Rodriguez entered the Waffle House with a small dog, pointed his hands into finger guns, and yelled "get on the ground, y'all are getting robbed!"

Rodriguez then said he was high and drunk before grabbing some napkins and leaving the store.

Deputies found the would-be "armed" robber at his home, where he admitted to robbing the restaurant of its napkins, according to the sheriff's office.

He now faces charges for unarmed robbery and assault.
